

Transfer Agreement

South College and Austin Peay State University

South College and Austin Peay State University hereby enter into a partnership that promotes student transfer and program articulation. The partnership facilitates the transfer of Associate degree course credit to program requirements for South College undergraduate health related programs.

The intent of the agreement is to encourage Austin Peay State University students to complete the Associate degree prior to transfer to South College. Austin Peay State University students who successfully complete the prerequisite courses in bold on the transfer table will have all – Austin Peay State University credits accepted for transfer without evaluation on a course-by-course basis (See Transfer Checklist associated with each program). Students with a GPA of 2.75 or higher will be guaranteed an interview for the program. This does not guarantee admission to any South College program. All other academic and program requirements for the major degree and college (such as the college admission requirements, grade point average, technical standards, interviews, drug/background screenings, observation hours, additional courses, etc.) must be satisfied. Students in any articulated program will not be expected to meet any additional (or fewer) requirements than non-transfer South College students.

1. Austin Peay State University will signify on the student's transcript that the Associate degree or the prerequisite courses for the program have been completed. South College will, when evaluating the student's transcript, honor the terms of the agreement for admission to South College.
2. Prior to completing the prerequisite courses or the Associate degree, students should have access to counsel from Austin Peay State University and/or South College staff on the program of study leading to completion of the prerequisite courses or the Associate degree. During this period, students should also have access to counsel by South College staff regarding requirements of the program of study at South College.
3. Students must meet all other graduation requirements of South College including the general, major, and professional education requirements. This includes minimum credit hours, institutional/departmental grade and grade point average requirements, and upper division credit and grade point average requirements, as stipulated in the South College Catalog.

- For participating students, the transfer agreement is effective for five years from the original entry into college level work at Austin Peay State University. If more than five years elapse from the student's initial date of participation under the agreement, the transfer agreement in place at the time of transfer to South College will determine the student's progress toward degree completion.

On an annual basis, South College will evaluate this partnership agreement and the transfer checklists. In collaboration with the partner institution, South College will discuss any issues or concerns and changes in intuitional credit transfer requirements. Revisions to the current agreement may be made as necessary.



Austin Peay State University transfer students will complete 82 credits to complete the Associate of Science in Dental Hygiene program at South College.
