



## Transfer Agreement

### South College and Chattanooga State Community College

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South College and Chattanooga State Community College hereby enter into a partnership that promotes student transfer and program articulation. The partnership facilitates the transfer of associate degree course credit to program requirements for South College undergraduate programs.

The intent of the agreement is to encourage Chattanooga State students to complete the Associate of Science (A.S.) degree prior to transfer to South College. Chattanooga State students who successfully complete the A.S. degree will have all Chattanooga State credits accepted for transfer without evaluation on a course-by-course basis (See Transfer Checklist associated with each program). This does not guarantee admission to any South College program. All other academic and program requirements for the major degree and college (such as the college admission requirements, grade point average, technical standards, interviews, drug/background screenings, observation hours, additional courses, etc.) must be satisfied. Students in any articulated program will not be expected to meet any additional (or fewer) requirements than non-transfer South College students.

1. Chattanooga State will signify on the student's transcript that the A.S. degree was completed according to the articulated curriculum. South College will, when evaluating the student's transcript, honor the terms of the agreement for admission to South College.
2. Prior to completing the A.S. degree, students should have access to counsel from Chattanooga State and/or South College staff on the program of study leading to completion of the A.S. degree. During this period, students should also have access to counsel by South College staff regarding requirements of the program of study at South College.
4. Students must meet all other graduation requirements of South College including the general, major, and professional education requirements. This includes minimum credit hours, institutional/departmental grade and grade point average requirements, and upper division credit and grade point average requirements, as stipulated in the South College Catalog.

5. For participating students, the transfer agreement is effective for six years from the original entry into college level work at Chattanooga State. If more than six years elapse from the student's initial date of participation under the agreement, the transfer agreement in place at the time of transfer to South College will determine the student's progress toward degree completion.
6. For students not completing an associate degree, South College will evaluate transcripts on a course- by-course basis.
