
Academic Preparation for Clinical Education

DPT 6530 PT Practice I (8-week clinical experience)



Students at this level will have completed coursework in: Anatomy, Physiology, Physical Agents, Musculosketal Practice, Therapeutic Inventions, Health Promotion and Fitness Management, Clinical Neuroscience, Neuromuscular Practice, Acute care and Cardiopulmonary Practice, HealthCare Delivery Models, and Advanced Movement Analysis. Pharmacology runs concurrent with PT Practice I.

Students at this level will be prepared to evaluate and treat patients with musculoskeletal, neurologic, and cardiopulmonary dysfunctions in a variety of practice settings, to include: acute, post-acute, skilled nursing and outpatient facilities.
