SPEAR PROGRAM

High school students who are motivated to become qualified pharmacists can take advantage of the School of Pharmacy Early Assurance Readiness Program (SPEAR). During the five-year program, committed students earn an Associate of Science in Health Science (Pre-Pharmacy), Bachelor of Science in Pharmaceutical Science, and Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD).

HOW TO APPLY

1. Create a PharmCAS account at www.PharmCAS.org and select South College as your school of interest.
2. Complete the PharmCAS application. You can save your work and come back before submitting.
 - Answer all required questions.
 - Write an essay.
 - Submit recommendation letters.

The South College School of Pharmacy strongly prefers three letters of recommendation. Two letters of recommendation are required.
 - Send a copy of your transcript to PharmCAS.

It is helpful to retrieve a copy for yourself to assist in manually entering your coursework into PharmCAS.
3. South College School of Pharmacy will review your completed PharmCAS application.
4. Attend your admissions interview.

Invitations to an admissions interview will be extended to applicants judged most qualified (based on a holistic application review) to those judged less qualified until the class is admitted.
